d) What does Jesus mean by saying 'all the law and the prophets hang on these two comma	andments' ?
4) Read Romans 8v1-4 a) What do you think Paul means by 'sinful nature' (or 'flesh' in some translations)?	
b) What does this passage say is the problem with trying to be 'good enough' by keeping Go	od's law?
c) Is this a problem with the law itself? Why?	
d) What does this passage say God did to satisfy the demands (or requirements) of the law?)

DIGGING DEEPER

Read Leviticus 19v1-37

- a) Classify each of the laws in this chapter into one of the following three categories:
 - i) Moral principle: tells us about right and wrong we need to still obey it today.
 - ii) Picture: teaching something but not for us to obey today
 - iii) Unsure: I'm not sure which category it comes under
- b) For each Moral principle, what is the 'spirit' behind the law, rather than just the 'letter' of the law?
- c) For each **Picture**, write down what it might be teaching us today.
- d) What is the overall message of these laws to you and how do you need to respond?
- e) What makes you Unsure about the other laws? How could you begin to clarify your understanding?
- f) Are there laws here that you feel you are guilty of breaking? Take time to pray this through to God.
- g) Why do you think the writer mixed up these different types of laws in one passage?
