CONNECT WITH THE MESSAGE

Prayer: Go and Ask your Dad

Luke 11:1-13

1) Who do you find it easiest to ask for help? What does this show you think about them?



Read Luke 11:1-13

2) What encouraged you most about prayer from Al's message on Sunday?

3) When have you found it most difficult to believe something about God being your good Father in Heaven who loves to give good gifts and to hear you?

4) What could you do differently to better express your daily dependence on God?

Read Matthew 6:5-8

5) Which approach to prayer does Jesus warn against in v5 and how might we do something equivalent nowadays?

6) What does Jesus say to do instead (v6) and how do you think all of this relates to praying with other Christians?

7) What does Jesus say we shouldn't do in v7 and why?

8) How does this relate to how you pray and what is meant to be encouraging about what Jesus says?

9) What is good about knowing that our Father God knows what we need before we ask him?

10) What is the most freeing or encouraging thing for you about prayer in this passage? Talk to your Father about it.

DIGGING DEEPER

Read Philippians 1:1-11

1) List some of the things Paul prays for the Philippian Christians.

- 2) What particularly gives him joy as he prays for them?
- 3) What signs are there that Paul is motivated to pray by God's fatherly goodness? What does he believe God will do for them?

4) What gives the impression that Paul is not just praying a one-off prayer for these Christians?

5) How does Paul feel about them personally?

- 6) From what he prays, what might you say that Paul thinks they most need?
- 7) What is big about his prayers and which big event is he praying towards?
- 8) Who could you pray some of these things for now?

9) Spend some time praying through these prayers for them and yourself.

CONNECT IN PRAYER

Paris Terrorist Attack

- Pray for families of 129 people who died and for the recovery of 350+ who were injured.
- Pray for the police and security forces, and against further terrorist attacks in France and other countries.
- Pray for all who have been caused to fear, that they would know God's peace as they look to him.
