
Volunteers Needed

CONNECT WITH THE MESSAGE

We're not Abel

Genesis 4:1-26

1) What's the worst present you've ever received?



Read Genesis 4:1-16 (or to v26 if time)

- 2) What did Jeff's message teach you about:
- a) People
- b) God
- c) Yourself

Was there anything you found particularly helpful?

Read Proverbs 28:13 and Genesis 4:7

3) What do you think are the hidden "crouching" sins currently in your life?

Ask someone who you are close to where they think you could be vulnerable to hidden sin in your life?

Read Hebrews 10:1-18

4) In light of Abel's offering to God, what does this passage teach us about sacrifices and offerings to God for us today?

5) What impact does Jesus' sacrifice have on our lives today and how we approach God, particularly looking at verses 10 to 14?

Read 1 John 1:9

6) Take some time to confess your sins to each other in small groups (perhaps pair up) trusting that he will forgive your sins because of Jesus' sacrifice.

Read Isaiah 53:7-11

7) What does this passage teach us about Jesus?

8) How should impact how we deal with conflict in our lives?

Read Matthew 18:21-22

- 9) How many times does Jesus tell the disciples we should forgive someone?
- **10)** Do you hold a grudge in your heart towards anyone in church, your family or elsewhere in your life? Spend some time in prayer to bring this to God.

DIGGING DEEPER

Read Deuteronomy 19:1-13

- a) What was the purpose of the cities of refuge?
- b) In what ways are God's mercy shown in this passage?
- c) How would Cain have been dealt with under these guidelines?
- d) How does this compare to God's judgement of Cain in Genesis 4?
- e) Why do you think that innocent blood shed was such an issue for Israel?

Read Numbers 35:33-34

- f) How does this help your answer to (e) above?
- g) Why don't we have cities of refuge today in the new covenant?
- **h)** How has Jesus' sacrifice of innocent blood changed how we think about this passage?
- i) What are the implications for you personally for Jesus being your "city of refuge" when you sin?

CONNECT IN PRAYER

Tunisia

- Pray for Tunisia at this time of grief and crisis.
- Pray for those who have lost loved ones in the shooting, that they will find comfort.
- Pray for Christians in Tunisia to reach out at this time with courage and compassion that their witness will be a stark contrast to the violence of ISIL.
